Speakers' Bio

Sarah MOUABBI is a Senior Research Economist at the Banque de France. Her research broadly covers financial economics, monetary economics and asset pricing. Sarah's research interests focus on the measurement of expectations and uncertainty, on



the pricing of debt securities and on the evaluation of the effects of monetary policy. Her work has been published in the Review of Finance, the Journal of Money, Credit and Banking, the Journal of Applied Econometrics, the Journal of Banking and Finance and the Journal of International Money and Finance.

Juan CARLUCCIO is a Scientific Advisor at the Directorate of International Economics and Cooperation of the Banque de France. He was previously Research Director at the Trade Secretariat of Argentina and a Research Economist at the Banque de France. His research focuses on international trade and investment



and on Latin-American macroeconomics, and has been published, among others, in the Review of Economics and Statistics, the Journal of International Economics, the Economic Journal, and the European Economic Review. Juan holds a Master in Economics from the London School of Economics and a PhD in Economics from EHESS.

Jean-Charles BRICONGNE is Deputy Director of the Business Surveys, Microeconomic and Structural Analysis Directorate of the Banque de France (BdF), and Adjunct Professor at Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne University. He was previously a seconded expert



at the European Commission (DG ECFIN) and the French National Statistical Institute (INSEE). He has written on various topics in applied trade analysis, globalisation statistics, financial macroeconomics, housing, migration, high-frequency indicators, and the implementation of datascience techniques in economics. He has published among others in the Journal of International Economics, the Scandinavian Journal of Economics, World Economy, and the Journal of Housing Economics. He holds a PhD from Paris School of Economics.

Margarita LOPEZ-FORERO is a Research Economist at the Banque de France. She works on different policy-relevant topics in international economics and their link with labor, public and development economics. Her professional experience includes



Paris-Saclay University, France Stratégie, OFCE-Sciences Po, and the Colombian coffee producers' NGO. Margarita has been a teaching assistant at Paris I and Paris-Nanterre Universities. She has published among others in the Journal of International Economics. She holds a PhD in Economics from the Paris School of Economics and Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University.

Nuno **COIMBRA** is а Senior Research Economist the at International Macroeconomics Division at the Banque de France. His academic work mostly centers around issues of macro-finance and international economics, with a special focus on heterogeneity among financial market



participants. His research has been published in journals such as the Review of Economic Studies, the Journal of Monetary Economics and the Journal of International Economics. He previously held an assistant professor position at Paris School of Economics after completing his PhD in Economics at the London Business School.
